Guest Speakers

Recent Speakers

Last week our District Governor, John Horton, visited with us to share information about Rotary International. Highlights of his presentation are below.

- The current President of Rotary International, Jennifer Jones, is the first female president for the organization. One of the core values she is working on is diversity.
- The top initiative for Rotary is membership growth, focusing on younger members and getting past Rotaritions reengaged.
- Another top initiate of the foundation is clean water and the continued focus on the eradication of polio. With Rotary's involvement in getting people around the world vaccinated we've saved 20M kids. At one time more than 350 cases of polio were diagnosed each year; last year there were only eight cases.
- There are four giving levels for Rotarians.
 - Basic \$25 per year
 - Sustaining \$100 per year
 - Paul Harris \$1,000 accumulative
 - Paul Harris Society \$1,000 per year
- A third initiative is improving the mental health of young girls. Suicide is the second leading cause of teenage deaths. Approximately 9% of high school students attempt suicide and girls are two times more likely.
- There are additional clubs Rotarians can join, including Action groups and Fellowship groups. Examples of fellowship groups include clubs for golfers, auto enthusiasts, scuba divers to name a few.
- Next year's District Conference will be in Springfield May 5-6. There are 51 clubs in our district, 4 rotaract clubs and an average of 45 members per club.

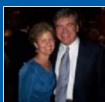
