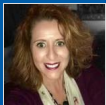

Recent Speaker

On March 1st, Ryan King, Park Superintendent of Ha Ha Tonka State Park, spoke to our assembled club members. Superintendent King was incredibly insightful about the conservation and safety work that is going on within the park. During the winter, he and his team oversee and perform necessary repairs to park trails, safety barriers, and conservation and preservation projects. While most visitors to the park are respectful and appreciative of the fantastic natural area that is a part of our home, he and his team do a lot of repairs and clean-up work done by individuals who are not respectful or appreciative of the park. His team has placed nine and a half miles of fire lines to protect and preserve our park. One of the park's most significant conservation projects this year is cleaning and maintaining the water caves. Caves have become clogged with gravel and debris. This causes the caves to become clogged and block off a natural area for the bats and other animals critical to the park's ecosystem. Over seventeen dump trucks of gravel have been removed from the caves. The viewing dock is currently shut down due to flooding. Repair and conversation work is ongoing to re-open the area for the summer season. Ha, Ha Tonka has 17 classified caves and numerous unclassified caves. If you are going to hike Ha Ha Tonka or explore the open caves, you must have good, closed-toed shoes, long pants, and hand lights (for caves). Please check in at the visitors center and talk with Superintendent King and the staff before entering the park. Proper planning allows you to arrange for guides and rent kayaks and paddle boards.
