State Tech Presents to the Breakfast Club

Last week the Breakfast Club enjoyed a presentation about State Tech by its President, Shawn Strong, and Vice President for Advancement, Shannon Grus. Shawn and Shannon explained that State Tech is like other state schools in that it is funded by the State of Missouri, as well as by tuition and private donations. They offer Associate of Applied Science degrees, currently to over 1700 students. Their programs range from electronics to automotive to medical radiology to dental assistant to nursing, and they have students interning at places like Caterpillar, Children's Mercy, and the St.

Louis Cardinals. Students take a wide range of courses, many which will transfer to 4-year colleges. And State Tech has a strong graduation rate, and a placement rate of 99%. Thanks to Kit for bringing us this excellent program.

Hold on your hat, because the total giving for Polio Plus and Nicole and Greg's Halloween Spooktacular Point Swap Party was **\$5080.00!** That means with 58 members in the club at the start of last Rotary year, each person gave almost \$90. To equal that each of our 53 members will need to give \$96.00.

Thursday, October 24, is the day established by Rotary International to commemorate the birth of Jonas Salk who led the first team to develop a vaccine against poliomyelitis. It is the day that we are asking each of our clubs to hold an event or take action to publicly shine a light on this terrible disease that persists in only select places of the world, as well as on the role Rotary plays in eradicating polio. We have made tremendous strides in getting this close to ending polio forever, and we must continue the fight until we can declare polio no longer a threat to humanity.
