### Fire Chief Matt Schofield Visits the Breakfast Club

This week's Rotary program was a 9-11 remembrance program by Jefferson City Fire Chief Matt Schofield and facilitated by Erik Janeczko. Through pictures and words, Matt Schofield described the role of Missouri Task Force 1 with the Federal Urban Search and Rescue. Matt brought to life the training and commitment that is needed in order to have a squad ready to go at a moment's notice. He also discussed deployments, including New York's 9-11, and some very close to home: the Joplin tornado, the Elks Lodge collapse in Clinton, and the Jefferson City tornado this spring. His presentation brought to light how well-prepared the Missouri Task Force is, and how much our local community benefits from having Matt Schofield at the helm of the Jefferson City Fire Department and as a Missouri Task Force 1 leader. Without his experience and skill and unbelievable quick response, I am very certain the tornado this spring might have had very different outcomes.
