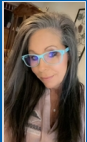

Join us on Tuesday, April 9, when we welcome Jill Rae with Care to Learn. *Care to Learn* is a Springfield, MO-based charity that partners with schools to fill emergent needs that stand between a child and their ability to learn.

The agency partners with school districts to provide emergent health, hunger, and hygiene resources to students, so they can worry less and play more.

Jill Rea joined the *Care to Learn* team in 2024 and currently supports Chapters through project coordination. Jill's background is in higher education, and most recently worked for a local community college supporting students as they navigate the world of higher education.
