## Last Meeting:

Sheriff Randee Kaiser recently highlighted the success of his county's unique Jail Treatment Program, housed within a 320-bed facility that averages 220 inmates. This addiction recovery program, the only one of its kind in Missouri, is offered both voluntarily and through court orders, providing a 120-day intensive pathway to sobriety and rehabilitation. Launched in 2022, the program has already seen 80 graduates. Sheriff Kaiser proudly shared stories of former participants who have since found employment, reunited with their families, and most importantly, remained clean and sober. The program's success rate has notably improved, with relapse rates dropping from 47% to just 11%. In addition to addiction recovery, the jail also offers a **Moral Recognition Therapy** program. This cognitive-behavioral approach helps participants reprogram negative thought patterns and improve decision-making, further supporting successful reintegration into society. These efforts reflect a growing recognition that rehabilitation, not just incarceration, is key to breaking the cycle of addiction and crime.
