Jim Stovall then spoke about his sudden blindness and stepping out of his familiar room to become a world-famous author and inspirational speaker.

Youth exchange youngsters from around the world were introduced, each bearing their country's flag to place on the stage. A panel of our recent exchange students told about their adventures heading overseas and how that changed their lives.

Rotaract, Interact and RYLA presentations were informative and important to the growth of Rotary. They were followed by a presentation on the American Wheelchair Mission, which was an inspirational way to close out the morning.

The afternoon events included the RI President's representative, Bill Pollard, and Bob McKenzie's "Race to End Polio" winning bike race that stretched from coast to coast. Business meetings show that the district is on a safe track. Then came the club presentations. Galen Engel was tapped to be one of the speakers about his Five-Year plan for Rotary After Hours.
