Jeremy Campbell | Paralympic Champion • World Record Holder • Speaker



Jeremy Campbell is a 5-time Paralympic gold medalist, ESPY Award winner, world record holder in the men's F64 discus and pentathlon, and one of the most decorated field athletes in Paralympic history.

Born with fibular hemimelia and undergoing amputation at age one, Jeremy has spent his life challenging limits—both visible and invisible. Through his keynote, *Beyond Any Limit*, Jeremy shares how he rewrote his story around disability and possibility, the power of returning to fundamentals, and the deeper freedom found in discovering your own global rhythm. His journey invites audiences to rethink resilience, redefine what's possible, and move beyond the labels that hold them back.
