Program: Alex London and Bryan Kyle

Alex London recieved his master♦s in museum science management with an emphasis on collections care at the University of Tulsa. While at TU, he served as a digitization assistant at the Gilcrease Museum and performed grant writing duties and assisted in exhibition design at the Philbrook Museum. After his graduation in 2018, he continued pursuing his museum career by developing youth educational programming for the Gilcrease Museum. He became the Collections Manager at the Tulsa Air and Space Museum in February 2019, and gained curatorial responsibilities in August of 2019.

Bryan Kyle is the Planetarium Manager at the Tulsa Air and Space Museum. He graduated from TCC in 2011 with an Associate♦s degree in Liberal Arts, and OSU in 2015 with a Bachelor♦s in Environmental Geology. He has been with the TASM since February of 2017 when he started as a volunteer. He is passionate about astronomy, owning seven telescopes (one a 16♦ Dobsonian!) and has models of nearly every manned spacecraft adorning his office. His current role at the Planetarium includes running the fulldome shows, narrating the live shows, creating new shows, coordinating with the ACT and the Jenk♦s sister planetarium, as well as general planetarium facility management.


