
John 3:16 Women's Refuge Center

Program: Steve Whitaker

Rev. Steve Whitaker is President, CEO and Senior Pastor of John 3:16 Mission, an interdenominational Christian rescue mission located in downtown Tulsa. John 3:16 feeds and shelters the homeless and also provides assistance to low income families that are struggling in troubled inner city areas.

Rev. Whitaker has been at John 3:16 Mission for 33 years working with the homeless and at-risk of our community. In that time, he has been instrumental in shaping the various ministries and programs offered by John 3:16.

Steve began his career with the Mission by starting programs for inner city children, youth and adults that eventually led to the creation of the Mission's Family & Youth Center facility in North Tulsa. In 2001, he became the Mission's Executive Director. Under Steve's direction, the Mission has been transformed from a small, "Soup Kitchen" style shelter with limited programs into a ministry offering the most comprehensive, faith-based care and recovery services in the city of Tulsa.

Steve is a 7th degree black belt with expertise in several martial arts disciplines and is a member of the American Bushido-Kai Association. He is the father of three grown sons (one of whom also works at John 3:16 Mission), seven grandchildren, and has been married to his wife, Sandy, for over 40 years.

ROD: Brian Huddleston

Brian Huddleston was born in a small town you haven't heard of in Arkansas. However, following a childhood boating accident in Antarctica, he was raised, and home schooled by penguins. Brian finally made his way back to the US and went on to graduate from Vanderbilt University with grades about the same as everyone else's. However, college was where he learned that his childhood guardians were wrong about all issues being black or white.

Brian decided to go to law school when he discovered that legal counseling was a lot easier than working. Brian received his law degree from the University of Arkansas where it is illegal to wear shoes. Thereafter, he spent several years living at a prestigious Tulsa oil and gas law firm until someone discovered his hideout and forced him to move on.

Brian has drafted more contracts than you've had slices of pizza and can document the purchase of a private island in the Caribbean if you would like. Regarding his legal writing skills, Brian modestly notes that: "It's not that those other lawyers are less talented than me... there are a lot of good lawyers out there. It's just that I seem to practice at this different---some might say higher---level than everybody else. That's really all it is."

Brian says: "I can win an argument on any topic, against any opponent. People know this, and that is why nobody talks to me at parties."

Brian lives in an undisclosed location with his wife, his enormous 18-year-old son, and a dog that is determined to urinate on every square inch of North America.

Brian is the owner of a successful real estate law practice. His favorite hobbies are kayaking and fishing, despite those painful Antarctica memories.
