Housing Solutions is the leader of the homeless response system for Tulsa County, an initiative known as <u>A Way Home for Tulsa</u>. As the lead organization, we oversee and implement a comprehensive plan, supporting service providers in adopting proven strategies to help those in need. Together, we're building a supportive community where everyone has a place to call home. In addition to leading the CoC, we also provide direct assistance in the areas of eviction prevention, homeless street outreach, and criminal justice.

- Martha Lowe mentioned an opportunity to volunteer for Meals On Wheels deliver dog food on weekends.

- We contributed an extra 7 pairs of shoes that did not make it to the PETS conference. Those will be donated to a homeless shelter.
- Jim Conner's daughter Jill has received her second double lung transplant in St Louis. The report is she is doing well.

#### Last Week's Program by Mike Bibby

Our speaker was Mindy Tinor from Oklahoma Alliance For Animals. OAA is a Tulsa based 501c3 nonprofit collaborative organization established in 2004. OAA is dedicated to reducing pet overpopulation, encouraging responsible pet ownership and promoting the humane treatment of animals through community collaboration and education. They have four areas of emphasis.

First is FIGHTING CRUELTY. They take a stand against animal neglect, abuse, and cruelty. We support law enforcement, help pay for necropsies conducted by the state lab, and silently attend court proceedings wearing red "No Excuse For Abuse" T-shirts to show support for prosecutors and the law.

Second is FIX OK. OAA is committed to reducing the state's tragic and costly pet overpopulation crisis. In Oklahoma, tens of thousands of dogs and cats are euthanized every year simply because they are homeless.

Third is UNCHAINOK. Chaining a dog is the most common form of animal abuse. Unchain OK volunteers work to reduce the number of dogs subjected to living on chains by educating the owners and providing alternatives to chaining. Chaining a dog 24x7 is illegal.

Fourth is the TURLEY PET PROJECT. Turley, while in Tulsa County, is not within city limits so it receives

no assistance from the city or city animal welfare services. There is a large unmet need in Turley for animal assistance. The project distributes dry dog and cat food, as well as other supplies when they are available, twice a month to pet parents in need. Numerous low-cost spay and neuter procedures have also been scheduled for Turley pets through the program.


