Speaker/Program Preview



Alexis Higgins is the Chief Executive Officer of Tulsa Airports Improvement Trust, an organization that oversees Tulsa International Airport and Tulsa Riverside Airport.

At Tulsa International, she leads an airport with over 3.2 million passengers annually that is home to 127 companies employing over 13,500 area residents. Tulsa Riverside airport is one of the top 10

busiest general aviation airports in the United States, with over 265,000 annual flight operations.

Ms. Higgins holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from the University of Tulsa, where she minored in marketing and Russian language.

She currently serves on the board of Airports Council International and leads donor funding for Challenge Air's Tulsa Fly Day event, an organization that inspires special needs children to dream big through the excitement of sitting as co-pilot on a flight.

This week's RoD: Barbara Smallwood

Barbara would love to be called a Baby Boomer, but is

officially a War Baby, as she was born during the war when her father was stationed in Santa Barbara, California. (Thus her name....) Her parents were both Okies so after the war they moved back to OK, where he earned his Architectural degree. Tulsa has been her home for over 70 years, with occasional stints in South Dakota, Minneapolis,



Kansas City, and Arkansas. She started her college career at OU and finished at TU with a B.S. in Business. ORU and Bank of OK were her employers until she joined IBM, where she spent over 27 years in sales and international marketing. She retired from IBM in 2007 as a Senior Marketing Consultant. She has traveled to Asia, Australia, Latin America and Europe many times with IBM. After retirement, she knew that she needed to get involved in the community. Her efforts have been focused on three key nonprofits: Tulsa Air and Space Museum, Tulsa Historical Society, and the Tulsa Botanic Garden. She was with the Tulsa Preservation Commission for 8 years and also served on the Boards of KIPP and the Girl Scouts of Eastern Oklahoma. She is a pastpresident of the National American Lawyers Auxiliary, and was President of the Tulsa Historical Society in 2014. She is an inactive member of the DAR. Her children gave her a refrigerator magnet that says 'Stop me before I volunteer again'.

Her husband, Allen, a local criminal defense attorney, has been in private practice in Tulsa for 40 years. They have been married for 34 years and have two children and 4 grandchildren. Son, David Collins, is an owner in the engineering firm Darr Collins in OKC; he and his wife April have two children, Rachel and Michael. Daughter, Rebecca Woodrum, works as an Oil and Gas Analyst; she has two daughters, Chelsie and Khloe.

Barbara is active in civic boards with a list that includes KIPP, Girl Scouts, Tulsa Preservation Commission, Tulsa Air and Space Museum, Tulsa Botanic Garden, Tulsa Historical Society and the National American Lawyers Alliance Barbara is a 20+ year_member of Tulsa Sunrise.

Part of our dues go to support our district.


