Last Week's Program by Mike Bibby

Our speaker last week was Gifty Benson. She spoke first about her project in Ghana and showed us pictures of the completed clinic. The clinic is awaiting equipment and supplies from MSNI.

The main topic of her presentation was the history of the slavery trade. She said about 12.5 million persons were taken as slaves but only 40% survived to reach the Americas. Slaves were taken because of the great need for manpower.

Captured slaves walked about 300 miles barefoot in chains to reach the coast of the Atlantic. There they were held in appalling conditions in the dungeon of a castle. Many died before being put in ships for the sea voyage. In ships the slaves were stacked in cramped spaces with no opportunity to use toilets, exercise or get fresh air. This lasted up to 12 weeks.

Abolition was started in 1803, 1833 in Great Britain and 1865 in the US.

Gifty showed a video about the horrors of the sea passage.
