Program Preview

Our guest speaker is the President of Ted Reeds Architecture and has 38 years of architectural experience. Reeds' project experience includes restaurant, lodging, office, urban mixed-use commercial and residential, and healthcare facilities, as well as new builds and renovations for multi-family residential, commercial developments and single-family residences.

As an advocate for a vibrant city he frequently gives guided tours and seminars to groups ranging from Leadership Oklahoma to visiting Chinese Students at Booker T. Washington High School. In March of 2015 Reeds hosted a tour of Tulsa Architecture on CSPAN.

Reeds is a founding member and past President of the Tulsa Foundation for Architecture (TFA), and gives Second Saturday Tours of Downtown

on a regular basis. A recently completed local design, Jackson Technical, won an AIA Citation Award with The McIntosh Group. Additionally he designed the Blue Rose Café on the Arkansas River at the 21st Street Bridge; the first habitable building on piers ever built in the City of Tulsa. As an equity partner in the four and a half acre site he is actively involved in the design of Phase II.

His work during his time in New York City (1980-1990 Ted Reeds Associates) has been noted in numerous *New York Times* articles and his design for Le Brun's Metro featured on the cover of *Interiors* magazine in 1986.

Reeds' interests outside of work include family, running, baseball, golf, OU Football, snow skiing, single malts, poetry, sculpture and good Provence Roses.

Timothy Holder is an 18-year Sunriser and one of the most steady presences in the club, who calmly has handled the audio-visual-digital components of our meetings in complexity.



Tim graduated from the University of Texas Medical School at Houston, and Family Practice Residency in Corpus Christi, Texas. Today he is Board Certified in both Family Practice and in Hospice and Palliative Medicine and is the Medical Director of Supportive Care Solutions of Tulsa since May of 2020.

He was previously Medical Director for Supportive Care and Survivorship at CTCA - Tulsa from 2013 to 2020. He has over 20 years of experience in Hospice and Palliative Medicine/symptom control and management. He has served on the Attorney General's Commission to Improve End-of-Life Care in Oklahoma. He has

received several awards, two of which were the 2004 Red Cross Everyday Hero Award and 2001 Five Who Care volunteer award.

Tim served on the board & as President of the Muskogee Morning Rotary Club from 1999-2000. He helped the club achieve 100% Paul Harris Fellow designation through their participation and fundraising for an International Matching Grant. When the Morning Club disbanded in 2002, he transferred to the Muskogee Rotary Club until his induction into Tulsa Sunrise in September 2015. While in the Muskogee Rotary Club, he served as Chair for Membership Development and as Director for International Service. He helped the club achieve an International Matching Grant for a project benefiting children with physical disabilities in Brazil.

In the Tulsa Sunrise Club, Tim served as the President-Elect in 2018 - 2019 and as Club President in 2019 - 2020. He is currently serving as an Assistant Governor for District 6110. Tim is an 8 time Paul Harris Fellow, a member of the Paul Harris Society and an Ambassador for MSNI.

He is married to Kaia, his wife of 30 years. Kaia is a cellist and previously played in the Fort Smith Symphony. They have 3 daughters. Tim has a heart for international mission work, having worked in East Africa, Nicaragua, and India.
