Last week's meeting

Our ROD was Bill Lawson. He opened with the pledge, a moment of silence and the Pledge of allegiance. The Sergeant-at-Arms was Steve Care. Megan announced the regular board meeting next Monday, August 14th at the district offices at 5:30P. Janet Cheek and Megan led a discussion of plans for the Lindsey House event on August 12th.

Members raised \$250 for school supplies and there were many supplies brought in to the club meeting. Bill Lawson auctioned off an OSU tee shirt for \$50. Proceeds to End Polio Now.

Our program was brought by Brett Brough, a Southside member and District DACdb trainer. He covered several subjects.



First was how to sign into DACdb. One starts with the website DACDB.COM or with the mobile app. Enter your ID and password, press enter and you are in. If you do not know your ID, Bill Lawson, Club Secretary, can help.

Next, Brett covered the MY CLUB tab at the top of the home page. Click on that tab and a number of icons appear. One will be CLUB MEMBERS. Click on that and a complete roster of club members will appear with the current board at the top. You can click on any name and see their individual information or you can click on a Word or Excel icon at the top right of the screen to download the complete roster.



While on that page, every member should click on their name and check their personal information. That info can be edited easily. If there is no picture, one can upload a (portrait) photo. It is very important that an emergency contact be listed. Brett described an event at his club where a person had to be sent by ambulance to a hospital and the emergency contact had to be notified.



Last, Brett talked about Engagement recording. Engagement is different from Attendance and it is very important to Rotary International. On the MY CLUB tab there is an icon titled ENGAGEMENT. Click on that and a full summary of Sunrise activities is shown. On the left side of the screen, under ENGAGEMENT NAVIGATION, click on ENTER PROJECT ACTIVITY to provide a screen where your personal activities can be recorded. If the project doesn't exist, our secretary can create it. The Pot Of Gold is currently \$236, but the joker is still elusive.

This Week's Program: Lemon-Aid

Lemon-Aid is a Labor Day Weekend city-wide fundraiser originally held from 1994 to 2000, where kids across Tulsa, Oklahoma donated their time to sell lemonade and all money raised went directly to benefit the children and families at the Tulsa Day Center for the Homeless. Over the course of seven Labor Day Weekends, with the help of more than 10,000 youth volunteers, Lemon-Aid raised more than \$350,000. Our speaker is Lemon-Aid founder Katie Murray. Ms Murray turns lemonade into a valuable philanthropic and entrepreneurial lessons for children of all ages. In 1993, at 10 years old, she had an idea to sell lemonade for a cause. The following year, her brainchild Lemon-Aid became a citywide venture over Labor Day weekend. Over seven years, Lemon-Aid involved more than 10,000 youth volunteers and raised more than \$350,000 for the Tulsa Day Center for the Homeless.

Almost 30 years later, Kat is still helping the homeless and encouraging kids to build better, healthier communities and be engaged youth

citizens by organizing and executing lemonade stands to support philanthropic causes in Tulsa. The Lemon-Aid Project is now a California-based non-profit that creates fun and engaging community activities for all ages while raising funds and awareness for children and family-related charities within the community. Kat is also the Owner/Principal at ROAM Communications, a boutique public relations consulting firm, focused on working with technology companies of all sizes on their community strategy and execution to meet their ongoing business objectives. She lives in Tulsa and is married with three beautiful children.
