

2024-2025: A Memorable Rotary Year for District 6110

With the 2024-2025 Rotary Year drawing to a close, it is important to review the many good things that have happened in District 6110 during the

past 12 months.

Great projects, events, and other programs have provided the most obvious impact for our Rotarians and their Clubs. Several of these have been large in-person events that require months of planning and many resources.

These have included:

- the Governor's Installation,

- SCRYE (Youth Exchange Conference),
- Mid-America PETS,
- D2D Project,
- Wheelchair Project to Mexico,
- the Legacy Campaign Celebration Dinner,
- 6110's District Conference, and the upcoming
- Rotary International Conference in Calgary.

Other programs have been presented virtually, to reduce needed travel, including:

- District Leadership Academy,
- Training Assemblies,
- Grant Seminars,



- Monthly Zoom meetings for District Leaders and/or interested Rotarians.
- Email communications have included my weekly Governor's Messages and this monthly District Newsletter done masterfully by Wally Bloss.
 Collectively, these programs have provided an enormous amount of information and

Collectively, these programs have provided an enormous amount of information and education for D6110 Rotarians and their Clubs, across our large four-state District.

Effective governance has made our Rotary District efficient and user-friendly. Leaders at every level have worked together to improve this organization. The D6110 Manual of Procedure (our operational guidebook) was revised and updated this year. Another milestone was reached with District 6110's incorporation in all our 4 states - greatly enhancing our business and legal functions. The District Office, in Tulsa, remains a dependable source of information and assistance, provided by employees Cole Adamson and Pat Phillips, with help from Rotarian volunteers. The support of our Governor-Line, Assistant Governors, Committee Chairs and Club officers has assured good access across District 6110.

Membership Growth has been facilitated by D6110's programs and leadership. In 2024-2025, District 6110 has grown to 74 chartered Clubs, with the addition of Cottey College's Rotaract Club (Nevada, MO) and the Rotary e-Club of Engagement (Oklahoma). There are also four Satellite/Companion Clubs - in Bentonville, AR, Springdale, AR, Bartlesville, OK, and Claremore, OK - with more Club expansion being considered. District 6110 now includes approximately 3,191 Rotarians. We need to maintain this positive membership momentum!

Record-setting benevolence has been District 6110's greatest achievement in this Rotary Year! We have developed a well-deserved reputation for generosity toward meaningful

projects. Led by D6110's first-ever Legacy Campaign, Rotarian and Club contributions reached record levels in every category. The Legacy Campaign provided \$3,375,000 in major gifts and bequests to The Rotary Foundation and its Endowment. Annual Fund, Polio Plus, and other giving exceeded \$710,000 in 2024-2025, leading to a per-capita average of \$223 per Rotarian in District 6110! This is made even better by the fact that these current gifts to TRF will provide an increasing return of District Designated Funds to help with clubs' local projects.

In summary, 2024-2025 has truly been a memorable Rotary Year in District 6110! As Marilyn and I visited all 75 Rotary Clubs and Satellites, it was very clear that D6110 is blessed with many devoted Rotarians, in great Clubs, who put "service above self" in their communities, this region, and the world. It has been a great honor to serve as the Governor of Rotary District 6110 this year, and to experience "the adventure of a lifetime"!

I also had the special privilege of telling the Trustees of our Rotary Foundation that District 6110, under the leadership of DG Warren Lovinger, had successfully raised over \$3 million in its Legacy Campaign. They were impressed! Congratulations to our District for its support of the world through The Rotary Foundation"



Get involved in an international exchange!

The District-to-District (D2D) Committee solicits **applications** for the proposed late October/early November 2025 visit by District 6110 Rotarians to Chile. In late April 2026, when the District 4355 team from southern Chile visit 6110, we will be looking for **hosts**.

The D2D is a wonderful opportunity to engage with Rotarians from southern Chile. The Chilean Rotarians will provide room and board in their homes, and many activities. The team will do activities and attend meetings as a group and do most things together. The schedule is very fast-paced as the District 4355 Rotarians want the team to see and do many things, and many clubs want the team to visit them. The key to a successful experience is flexibility and the ability to adapt. Some **knowledge of Spanish** is a tremendous asset, as the meetings are conducted in Spanish and many of the Rotarians do not speak English. Each member of the team will give a presentation to the clubs in Spanish. The duration of the trip is approximately 15 days.

The deadline for applications (which are attached to the Newsletter email) is **July 12th**, **2025**, and interviews will be held at the District


