### From the Governor

Greeting Rotarians,

The theme for November is the Rotary Foundation. What better way to start the month than with the Rotary Foundation Banquet which was held at Heifer International on Thursday, October 27. The weather was perfect and the program exceptional.

Beth Stubbs, who will serve as a Rotary Director from Zones 30 and 31 (District 6150 is in Zone 31) from 2023 to 2025, gave a wonderful presentation. She illustrated how Rotary districts can leverage their funds with Rotary International to fund projects around the world. Beth is from the Maryville Rotary Club in eastern Tennessee.

We also celebrated the twentieth anniversary of the Farmers Feed the Children Project sponsored by Heifer International, the Little Rock Rotary Club, and the Cluj-Napoca, Romania Rotary Club. The project's success was featured at the 2005 Rotary Centennial International Convention in Chicago, and it was honored by the United Nations. Ovidiu Spinu and Viorel Bunea came from Romania to bring us up to date on the project, which continues to be a huge success. Ovidiu also described the humanitarian aid Rotary Clubs in Romania are providing for its neighbor to the east, Ukraine.

In Rotary Year 2021-2022, several clubs in District 6150 supported the Rotary Foundation. The Honor Roll is as follows.

The top three clubs for Rotary per capita giving were West Little Rock (\$180.98 per capita), Sherwood (\$177.72 per capita), and Little Rock Metro \$137.68 per capita).

Six clubs were One-hundred Percent Foundation Giving Clubs. This is an average of \$100 per capita giving and 100% member participation, with every dues-paying member contributing at least \$25 to any or all of the following during the Rotary Year: The Annual Fund, Polio Plus Fund, approved global grants, of the Endowment Fund. They were

- Jonesboro
- Quad Cities of Sharp County

Four clubs were designated Every Rotarian, Every Year Clubs. These clubs achieved a minimum of \$100 per capita during the Rotary year with every dues-paying member contributing at least \$25 to the Annual Fund. They were

Five clubs received an End Polio Now Certificate of Appreciation. These are clubs which contributed \$1,500 to Rotary's polio eradication efforts. They were

### Nominate your Club Officers Now

Clubs it is time to nominate new officers & schedule elections in December.

### IRS' Annual Filing Requirement

Whether your club is a subordinate under Rotary International's 501(c)(4) group exemption or is independently tax-exempt, the IRS requires that all Rotary clubs in the U.S. and its territories file an annual information return. For those clubs whose tax year follows the Rotary year, the deadline to file is 15 November. The form a club must file is dependent upon its gross receipts for the year.

### District Nominating Committee

The district nominating committee is accepting nominations for District Governor-nominee designate, who will serve as the district governor in 2025-26. Each club can suggest one person if there is a candidate from your club that would be willing to serve in that Rotary year. Instructions have been emailed to each club President and Assistant Governor on how to submit your club's nomination. All forms must be mailed by December 1, 2022.
