From the Governor

Wow, what a year! I know I came into Rotary Year 2023-24 wanting to do it all. I set BIG goals for myself and our clubs. As a reminder, here's what we wanted to accomplish:

Invite more people to Rotary - Our clubs inducted 200 new members since July 1st. **GREAT WORK!**

Engage current members to retain membership - We lost/terminated 193 members in the same time period.

District-wide financial gift to Heifer International - We collected \$7000. This will be presented this month.

District-wide Service Project supporting AR Imagination Library - Each club participated in spreading the word about this program, encouraging enrollment or by contributing to their local affiliate. In addition, the District gave \$10,000 to AR Imagination Library through the clubs, so the funds stay in your local community.

NEW Rotary Foundation Fundraiser - We had a very successful fundraiser, bringing in over \$120,000 from October - February. We also had a fantastic Foundation Gala on Rotary's birthday (2/23).

Bring back RYLA - We successfully started the Rotary Youth Leadership Award program again after a 4-year hiatus. We've also moved the leadership weekend to the fall with the next offering being October 17-20, 2024.

Inspiring & informative District Conference - We held this conference in Little Rock in April with District 6170. The presentations were very informative and entertaining. All who attended raved about the content. I just wish more of our members attended.

Polio Plus Society - We established the Polio Plus Society for those who commit to donating \$100/ year to End Polio. To date, 86 members have joined. To become a member of the PPS, just [email me](#) and then send \$100 to The Rotary Foundation. I'll get you your pin, bracelet and certificate. (I'll be sending out these items to club Presidents before month-end for those who have not received them yet.) Reminder that the easiest way to give to the Rotary Foundation is through Rotary Direct (www.rotary.org/give).

So, it has been a very busy Rotary Year. The only way we accomplished so much is because of the work done by members across our district. YOU are the reason Rotary happens. The work of Rotary is done at the club level. Not only did clubs participate in District initiatives but also sponsored programs in their own communities. Please accept my sincerest THANKS for the service and financial contributions you gave this year to make our world a better place. Big shout out to the Rotary Presidents class of 2023-2024!!! Without your leadership, I don't know if we could have been so successful.
