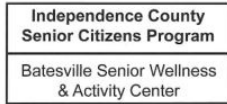

## Who We Are

***Our goal is to help seniors remain active & independent, and enhance their quality of life.***

The Independence County Senior Citizens Program established in 1974, operates four senior centers throughout Independence County, located in: Batesville, Oil Trough, Newark and Cushman. We are the Batesville Senior Wellness & Activity Center, which serves as all these centers' headquarters.

The services provided by the centers include Congregate Meals, Home Delivered Meals, Transportation, Wellness Activities and Social Events.

The program operates on a budget of \$540,000. Funding comes from federal,

state, and county governments, as well as United Way, senior citizen contributions, fund-raising, and private donations. Annual expenses for the program include: food for 31,457 meals, fuel for 9 vehicles that will altogether travel 71,119 miles, insurance, salaries, utilities, supplies, vehicle and building maintenance and more.

Cost of services provided to the seniors is minimal in comparison to the estimated \$7,500,000.00 In Medicaid that would be spent otherwise to provide for their needs in nursing homes.
