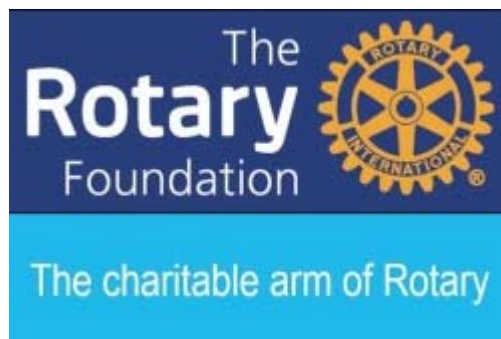
## Table Toppers -- The Rotary Foundation

### Keep Arkansas Beautiful



Colbie Jones, Director of Keep Arkansas Beautiful, was our guest speaker last week. She spoke on how we could do our part to keep our city beautiful.

The Keep Arkansas Beautiful program serves the entire state of Arkansas. Its main mission is educating the public on what they can do to keep their hometowns beautiful. Having grown up in a family that went camping, Jones realized first hand how litter can ruin the trip. She said it was everyone's responsibility to create a beautiful scenic roadway and neighborhood.

Cigarette butts are the most littered item. They can start wildfires and destroy the lives of animals as well as humans. Littering also has an impact on a city's economic development. It gives visitors and businesses a negative impression of a town and decreases property values. It shows that the citizens don't care about their home. Keeping the land clean of litter and beautifying the environment can add 2.4 million dollars to the value of the state.

What can you do to keep Arkansas beautiful?

- You can join the Great Arkansas cleanup in the fall.
- You can keep your surroundings clean.
- You can report littering. If you spot a littering violation along any streets, roads or highways, call to report the situation. All types of trash and all types of vehicles are subject to being reported. Get the person's license plate number or address. The violators will receive a letter stating that they have been reported and remind them that littering is illegal in Arkansas with up to a \$1,000 fine.
