Kay C. Goss, CEM, Former Assistant Director, Federal Emergency Management Agency

Kay Goss is a native of Tontitown. BA and MA at UAF, doctoral studies in Public Administration at West Virginia University, and doctoral studies at American University, with part-time teaching at UA, UALR, ATU, UAFS, Chief Deputy State Auditor, Research Director for 1979-80 Arkansas Constitutional Convention, Project Director for Association of Arkansas Counties, and senior assistant to two Arkansas state governors, coordinating fire service, emergency management, emergency medical services, public safety, and law enforcement for 12 years. She then was nominated by President as the associate Federal Emergency Management Agency director for National Preparedness, Training, Higher Education, Exercises, and International Partnerships, U.S. Senate confirmed unanimously. She then was a private-sector government contractor at Electronic Data Systems as a senior emergency manager and homeland security advisor and at SRA International as the director of emergency management services. She is a senior fellow at the National Academy for Public Administration and on board of advisors for DRONERESPONDERS International. She has also been a graduate professor of emergency management at the University of Nevada at Las Vegas for 16 years, Istanbul Technical University for 12 years, the MPA Programs Metropolitan College of New York for five years, and George Mason University. She has been a certified emergency manager for 27 years; Arkansas Tech University Emergency Management and Homeland Security Program Advisory Council Member for 28 years; Metropolitan College of New York Emergency Management and Homeland Security Advisory Council for 15 years; and founder of the FEMA Higher Education Program, established in 1994, starting with a handful of institutions and now including more than 600

May 20: Battle of Fallujah 20th Anniversary, Dr. Jamie Griffin, Head of School, Episcopal Collegiate

Dr. Jamie Griffin, Head of Episcopal Collegiate School, will share his remarkable story as an aircraft maintenance officer with Marine All-Weather Attack Squadron 242, the "Bats," during their historic 2004-2005 deployment to Iraq. Stationed at Al-Asad Airbase, the Bats maintained a record-setting operational tempo, flying F/A-D Hornets, delivering over 8,000 flight hours and 400,000 pounds of precision ordnance in support of coalition forces, including critical air support during Operation Phantom Fury's Second Battle of Fallujah and Iraq's first democratic elections in January 2005.

The talk goes beyond military history - it's a compelling exploration of leadership, resilience, and teamwork under pressure. Jamie will share insights from this award-winning deployment, honored as "Marine Fighter Squadron of the Year" in 2005, and share strategic lessons that continue to guide his leadership in education today. Whether you're inspired by aviation, history, or practical leadership strategies applicable to any field, this presentation will captivate and inspire.
