# Little Rock Port Authority: Current Impact and Exciting Future Bryan Day, Executive Director

Bryan Day has dedicated more than thirty-five years to state and local government, consistently focusing on building and strengthening communities. Since June 2014, he has served as the Executive Director of the Little Rock Port Authority, which was established in 1959 to "drive economic development by providing a world-class transportation hub connecting Arkansas to the global economy."

Before leading the Port Authority, Bryan spent two decades with the City of Little Rock, where he held key roles including Assistant City Manager and Director of Little Rock Parks and Recreation. His public service career began in 1987 with the Arkansas State Park system.

As Executive Director of the Port, Bryan oversees more than 50 industries within a 5,000-acre industrial park. He also manages the Port Authority Railroad, the Industrial and Slackwater Harbors, and Foreign Trade Zone 14. In 2023 alone, the Port of Little Rock handled approximately 9,000 railcars and 800,000 tons of river cargo.

Bryan is deeply engaged in both professional and community service. He serves on the St. Louis Federal Reserve Transportation Advisory Council, the Central Arkansas Library Foundation Board, the Board of Visitors for UA Pulaski Technical College, the MBTC Maritime Transportation Advisory Board, the Arkansas District Export Council, the UALR School of Business Advisory Council, and the Arkansas Repertory Theatre Board of Directors. He also currently serves as President of the Arkansas Oklahoma Port Operators Association.

Bryan earned both his undergraduate degree and Master of Public Administration from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. He is also a graduate of Harvard Kennedy School's Senior Executives in State and Local Government program.

Outside his professional endeavors, Bryan enjoys an active lifestyle. He is an avid biker, hiker, and camper, with a deep appreciation for America's national parks—particularly the wilderness areas in his home state of Arkansas. He is also a proud father to a daughter who is a nurse at Northwestern Hospital in Chicago and a son who is a loan officer with First Service Bank of Arkansas. At home, he's the beloved human to one very spoiled Labrador Retriever.

## May 20: Battle of Fallujah 20th Anniversary, Dr. Jamie Griffin, Head of School, Episcopal Collegiate

Dr. Jamie Griffin, Head of Episcopal Collegiate School, will share his remarkable story as an aircraft maintenance officer with Marine All-Weather Attack Squadron 242, the "Bats," during their historic 2004-2005 deployment to Iraq. Stationed at Al-Asad Airbase, the Bats maintained a record-setting operational tempo, flying F/A-D

Hornets, delivering over 8,000 flight hours and 400,000 pounds of precision ordnance in support of coalition forces, including critical air support during Operation Phantom Fury's Second Battle of Fallujah and Iraq's first democratic elections in January 2005.

The talk goes beyond military history - it's a compelling exploration of leadership, resilience, and teamwork under pressure. Jamie will share insights from this award-winning deployment, honored as "Marine Fighter Squadron of the Year" in 2005, and share strategic lessons that continue to guide his leadership in education today. Whether you're inspired by aviation, history, or practical leadership strategies applicable to any field, this presentation will captivate and inspire.
