Book: Atomic Habits, James Clear

Atomic Habits by James Clear emphasizes the transformative power of small, consistent changes. Clear argues that success doesn't come from massive overhauls but from tiny habits that compound over time. He introduces a four-step model—cue, craving, response, and reward—and outlines four laws of behavior change to build good habits: make them obvious, attractive, easy, and satisfying. The book stresses identity-based habits, encouraging readers to focus not just on outcomes but on becoming the kind of person who embodies the behaviors they want. Ultimately, it's a guide to mastering the process of lasting self-improvement through incremental daily actions.
