July 9: RY 24.25 Kick Off with President Jason Chacko

President Jason Chacko kicked off the new Rotary year with the inspiring theme: Global Hearts, Local Hands. The Rotary Club of Little Rock offers Central Arkansans the chance to make a difference locally and globally. The connections we build help us leave a lasting legacy in our communities. July 16: Economic Updates with Randy Zook, CEO, Arkansas State Chamber

Arkansas State Chamber's President and CEO **Randy Zook** presented Arkansas' economic performance, revealing that the state was ranked 15th most competitive by the American Legislative Exchange Council for two consecutive years. He noted a 9% growth in the economy in 2021, outperforming neighboring states like Texas, and a 6.3% job growth since 2020. However, he also pointed out challenges such as a significant labor shortage, with 2.2 jobs available for every person in the workforce, and a low labor force participation rate. Zook emphasized the need to address these issues, particularly the labor shortage, to drive economic growth and highlighted the importance of immigration in maintaining the labor supply. 


July 23: Ottenheimer International Scholars Program: A Madagascar Primer


Member Videos: Making Connections Around the Globe

President Chacko's Connections

A note about the President's Moment at Rotary meetings from President Jason Chacko

In line with our Rotary Year theme of Global Hearts, Local Hands, l've decided to use my President's minute to highlight Rotary Clubs around the globe. There are more than 46,000 clubs worldwide, and while we will not get to each of them, we will take a minute to learn about one club a week this year, from their history, membership or special projects they support.



July 16, 2024: Rotary One, Chicago, Illinois

This week, we'II be looking at where it all started: Rotary Club one, in Chicago, Illinois. Club one was founded on February 23, 1905, by Paul Harris and five of his business friends as a business networking group, and they created much of the lore of Rotary: Arthur Sheldon created the first motto: He Profits Most Who Serves Best. Montague Bear designed the Rotary Wheel, to represent the rotating meeting location between each of their offices, and Herbert Taylor wrote the Four Way Test. As a group, they went on to establish Rotary International in 1910. Today, Club One boasts over one hundred members, and their club One Foundation continues to drive their service, highlighted by Job1, a summer internship providing over 500 internships a year in a partnership with the City and Chicago Public School Districts; they are approaching their 20th year of this project in 2025. And so today, we toast the Rotary Club of Chicago, Club One of Rotary for continuing the legacy of our founders.

July 23, 2024: Rotary in Madagascar


This week, l'm hoping not to steal the thunder of our presentation, with a look at Rotary in Madagascar. There are currently 18 clubs on the island, representing over 360 members. The oldest club is one of 8 clubs in the Capital City of Antananarivo, chartered in 1958. Interestingly, the island of Madagascar declared independence from French rule in 1958, although they celebrate their official Independence Day on June 26, 1960. Since then, this French-speaking club has partnered with Rotarians around the world to continue humanitarian efforts on the island, from fresh water projects to education, maternal health and disease prevention; this Rotary club has truly built on the Seven Pillars of Rotary Service. The club is District 9220, along with other Indian Ocean Islands like Mauritius and the Seychelles, a fact I wish I had known before going to my district training in Ft. Smith. So, this week we toast all 18 Malagasy clubs, including Club 17266 in Antananarivo.

July 30, 2024: Rotary Clubs of Greece



This week, I would be remiss if I didn't mention that little party happening in Paris right now, the Olympics! Athletes from 206 different countries are competing in this year's games, a poignant number to my medical background, which reminds me how many bones I could break if I tried any of those sports myself. Instead of focusing on Paris, however, l'm going back to where it all started; Greece! The country currently has 84 different Rotary clubs, and while there is no club located in Olympia, the city where the

Ancient games were held from the 8th Century BC to the 4th Century AD, there are a few clubs located in Athens, where the modern games were started in 1896. The largest club in Athens is also the oldest, Club 13410, founded in December 1928, and is one of the first 100 Rotary clubs of Europe at just 32 years younger than the modern Olympics. As a member of the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church here, Greece has always been high on my list of places to visit, and while I wasn't able to attend a Rotary meeting due to their himonthly meeting schedule. 




Rotary Club 99: Tuesday, August 13, 2024

Frank O'Mara, Author, Bend Don't Break

In recognition of the close of the 2024 Summer Olympic Games in Paris, we have one of Arkansas' most successful former Olympians, **Frank O'Mara** (three-time Olympian and two-time World Champion in the 3000 meters, and former Alltel executive) discussing his new book, *Bend Don't Break*, with fellow Little Rock runner and business person, **Gary Taylor**. The book chronicles Frank's running and business accomplishments and setbacks and how they prepared him for his new fight against early-onset Parkinson's disease. Copies of the book will be available for purchase, with a portion of the proceeds going to Parkinson's research.





Frank O'Mara, is a former Irish runner. A three-time Olympian, he was twice World Indoor Champion in the 3,000m. Frank gained post-graduate degrees from the University of Arkansas and went on to have a successful career in wireless with Alltel. He was diagnosed with early-onset Parkinson's disease at the age of forty-eight.

London native **Gary Taylor** showed an early talent for running, breaking the 16-year-old world record in the 1500 meter at 16 and running a sub-4 minute mile at 18, representing Great Britain. In 1982, Taylor joined the University of Arkansas track team, where he was a 2-time All American, won multiple conference titles, set a world record in the Distance Medley and ran the top two fastest 1500m splits in the history of the Penn Relays, times that still stand today. His proudest honor was Captaining the U of A Cross Country team to a NCAA championship. Turning his competitive nature to business, Taylor morked for Walmart as Director of Strategic Applications and for Alltel, where he was VP of

information reciniology prior to the vertzon acquisition. Taylor is currently the managing Director of Operations for Sowell management, a financial services company in north Little Rock
