

GRAND OPENING: Arkansas Symphony Orchestra New Home

Featuring Christina Littlejohn, Chief Executive Officer, Geoff Robson, Music Director, moderated by Past President Natalie Ghidotti







Christina Littlejohn, Chief Executive Officer

Christina Littlejohn's professional career includes starting and building the Mobile Symphony (AL), launching The Cleveland Orchestra's Miami Residency, and navigating the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra from near bankruptcy in 2009 to an artistically and financially healthy orchestra that puts service to its state first. The Arkansas Symphony raised \$11.75M to build the new ASO Stella Boyle Smith Music Center, a radically welcoming hub of musical activity for all Arkansans, which will open in September 2024. During the Pandemic, the ASO reached over a million people in over thirty countries with its "Bedtime with Bach†series, kept all full-time musicians and staff employed, and continued its education programs and even expanded them to serve more students across the state. Christina was recently recognized by the state with the 2023

A cellist, she earned a BA from Furman University and an MBA and MA from the University of Cincinnati/Cincinnati Conservatory of Music. She has enjoyed leadership development training at the business schools of Stanford University, University of Michigan, and Harvard through National Arts Strategies.

In 2017, she gave a TedX talk titled â€ceTransform a Symphony, Change a Community,†and is a frequent speaker on the topics of Governance and Leading through Change.

Geoffrey Robson, Music Director

Geoffrey Robson, the Music Director of the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra, is a prominent figure in the U.S. music scene. Recognized with the 2017 Respighi Prize in Conducting, Robson's tenure with the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra (ASO) has been marked by notable success and innovation.

Robson's dynamic leadership during the Covid-19 pandemic garnered national attention, with the ASO's Bedtime with Bach online series being featured by the Washington Post and the Kelly Clarkson Show. His contributions to the planning and development of the new ASO Stella Boyle Smith Music Center, set to open during his directorship, were pivotal in securing \$11.7 million in funding and community support.

Throughout his time with the ASO, Robson has led critically acclaimed concerts and introduced innovative programming, attracting new audiences and invigorating the orchestra. He views his role as a connector, aiming to bring the community closer and foster inclusivity.

In 2021, Robson conducted and executive produced the ASO's first commercial recording in over two decades, featuring Florence Price's Concerto in One Movement with pianist Karen Walwyn. He has also conducted numerous ballet and opera productions and was a founding member of The Chelsea Symphony in New York.

During the 2023-2024 season, Robson will guest conduct the Greenville Symphony and the Orlando Philharmonic Orchestra, with additional appearances to be announced. He continues to champion new music, having premiered works by James Stephenson, Bonnie Montgomery, Joe Brent, and Karen Griebling. He secured co-commissions for new pieces by Tania León and James Lee III for the ASO.

An accomplished violinist and chamber musician, Robson is also the Artistic Director of the Faulkner Chamber Music Festival, where he curates a summer concert series and directs a chamber music camp for students. He has served as concertmaster of the Connecticut Virtuosi Chamber Orchestra and Assistant Concertmaster of the Waterbury Symphony and is a sought-after studio musician.

Robson studied orchestral conducting at Mannes College of Music under David Hayes and holds violin performance degrees from Yale University and Michigan State University Honors College. His violin mentors include Erick Friedman, Dmitri Berlinsky, James Krehbiel, and I-fu Wang. He also studied conducting at Yale with Lawrence Leighton Smith, Edward Cumming, and Shinik Hahm.

This initiative, in partnership with the Arkansas Bankers Association, is designed to significantly boost financial innovation in the state and position Arkansas as a leader in the global banking industry.

October 8 Artificial Intelligence (Al) with Congressman French Hill

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is one of the hottest topics in news and conversation around the country today. Rep. French Hill will come to discuss AI and his leadership in Congress on AI as the Chairman of the House Financial Services Subcommittee on Digital Assets and Financial Technology, Co-Chair of the Committee's AI Working Group, and appointment by Speaker Mike Johnson to the AI Task Force in the House of Representatives. The potential impacts of AI on all parts of our society are enormous, but the level of understanding of AI's possibilities is full of naivete, from business leaders, ordinary Americans, and policymakers. In his talk, Rep. Hill will lay out his guiding principles on AI, what policymakers are doing on AI today, and what he envisions the future of AI might look like.

October 15 Winthrop Rockefeller: From New Yorker to Arkansawyer with author John Kirk

Winthrop Rockefeller looms larger than life in the modern history of Arkansas. Join us as **John Kirk**, George W. Donaghey Distinguished Professor of History at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, discusses his award-winning biography *Winthrop Rockefeller: From New Yorker to Arkansawyer, 1912-1956.* Kirk's book has been awarded the 2024 Booker Worthen Literary Prize from the Central Arkansas Library System and the J.G. Ragsdale Award, given annually by the Arkansas Historical Association for the best book on Arkansas history.
