All Things Oscar: Predictions, Thoughts, Snubs

Join us on Tuesday, Feb. 6, as we celebrate the FUN that is the 2024 Oscars! Club 99's **Chris Mangum** will host a Q&A with two professional film critics who happen to hail from Arkansas: **Michael Cook** and **Keith Garlington**. We'll get a front row seat into all of the hits, misses, glory and snubs that make up the Academy Awards each year.







Moderator Chris Mangum is co-founder and CEO of Servato, a technology company managing backup power for some of the country's largest broadband service providers. Chris and Servato recently relocated to Little Rock from New Orleans, along with his wife, three kids, mother-in-law and dog. Chris grew up in McGehee, Ark., where he graduated from McGehee High School, and his parents now live in Monticello, where he often spends weekends with his kids and their grandparents. Chris left Arkansas after high school to earn a BA in Psychology from Rhodes College, did a brief stint in the Army as an intelligence officer, and earned a law degree and MBA from Emory University. He worked in innovation and strategy roles for large telecom companies such as BellSouth and CenturyLink (where as chief strategy officer he grew the company's market cap ten-fold in just five years to \$26 billion). Chris launched Servato in 2015. He also co-founded and led a venture capital firm called Venture X Group, with offices in Atlanta and Palo Alto, Calif. At VXG, he helped launch more than 100 companies in about 10 years.

Michael Cook has been a film critic for the past 13 years and a film buff his entire life. He shares his reviews every Friday morning on KLRT-TV's Good Day Arkansas and also appears on KARK-TV's Arkansas Style. Micahel is a "tomato-meter-approved†critic on Rotten Tomatoes and is Arkansas' only member of the Critics Choice Association. He is also the owner of Cook Consulting, a public relations and political consulting firm in Little Rock.

Keith Garlington is an Arkansas-based film critic who has been formally reviewing movies for nearly 15 years. He is the founder, film critic and features writer for Keith & the Movies and also a contributing film critic for the Arkansas Democrat-Gazette. Keith is a member of the Southeastern Film Critics Association and the Online Film Critics Society. He has covered a range of film festivals, including the Sundance Film Festival, Little Rock's Filmland, the Hot Springs Documentary Film Festival (where he has served as a jury member), and the upcoming El Dorado Film Festival. Keith resides in Fordyce with his wife of 28 years, Jacki, and their two children, Brady and Julie.

President Ghidotti's Power of Fun Tip of the Week

Today's tip was inspired by today's member video, which I know you will enjoy! This member talks about the little moments that actually make up her fun moments, and I think that's really important for all of us to remember as we learn about The Power of Fun.The Power of Fun doesn't mean you have to bungee jump or play the guitar in a band – though I highly recommend bungee jumping for a True Fun moment!

The Power of Fun *can* be bigger things that are planned out and thought through, but *mostly* it's about the little moments in our life that we make room for – what Catherine Price calls "delights.†It's all about creating a Fun Mindset and being open to fun whenever and wherever.

It's about being open to being playful – even in little ways – that can affect your moment-to-moment experience and improve your mood. And figuring out ways to add even teensy bits of playfulness, connection and flow to your everyday activities can even make some of those objectively non-fun activities more tolerable. l'm picturing "A Spoonful of Sugar†with Mary Poppins … "In every job that must be done, there is an element of fun. You find the fun and SNAP the job's a game.â€

Not that scooping cat litter or scrubbing a toilet is going to be real fun, but you get the point. The more you can cultivate a Fun Mindset in your everyday life, the lighter your everyday life will feel. And if anyone can find a fun way to make cleaning a toilet fun, let me know!

Catherine Price has a whole section in the book about Seeking Delight, which we'll delve into more on another day, but I want to call out a book she references, "The Book of Delights†by poet Ross Gay. Ross took a full year and wrote an essay each day about an everyday delight – pecans, strong espressos, people who call him "sweetie,†a friend's unabashed use of air quotes and more ordinary wonders.

The point? To remind us of the small joys and FUN that we often overlook because we're all too busy. A reminder that the small delights in our everyday can create those powerful True Fun moments. Ross' book is going to be the next book I check out at CALS unless one of you beats me to the punch!

It's all a reminder that our lives are what we pay attention to. If we train ourselves to notice the small delights of the everyday â€" the everyday beauty and kindness and amusing absurdities, the things that make us laugh or that we feel grateful for â€" we will feel more positive. If we pay more attention to sources of playfulness, connection and flow, we'II have more fun.
