Did You Miss Feeding America CEO Claire Babineaux-Fontenot?



Claire Babineaux-Fontenot began her remarks with "I came from a large family, what does that mean to you?" After guesses from the audience from 10 to 20, she gave her answer of 107! She has 107 siblings, from biological to fosters to adopted. Babineaux-Fontenot framed her conversation with her personal background highlighted by her "large" family. As the head of the national Feeding America organization, she characterized it as a grassroots network of food banks across the nation. In the coffee table-style presentation, our own Sarah Riffle of the Arkansas Food Bank, asked Babineaux-Fontenot to discuss Covid-19's impact on the issue of food insecurity. She described the pandemic as transformational, as food banks were forced into dealing with a disaster, the same one simultaneously across the nation and around the world. Remarkably, during the pandemic, a record 6.7 billion meals were provided! Yet, people struggling with food insecurity rose from 29 million to more than 40 million.
