She is currently in her 15th year in a rewarding career for a Fortune 500 company. Janai is also a published Author.

Her passions are anything that includes bringing Racial and Cultural Diversity Awareness, Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence Awareness, and Period Poverty. In 2017, she established her own organization, More Chances Period. Janai received the 2022 Woman of Excellence from Sister Friends United for her work with fighting Period Poverty. She belongs to the Dorothy Mae Foster McCain Society with the Junior League of Little Rock. Janai was featured in URBANE Magazine for her work in the community helping Menstruators. More Chances Period has also been featured on THV11 the Vine and KATV Community Connections.

Janai holds a Certificate in Anti-Racism from the Diversity and Resilience Institute of El Paso, has a Sexual Assault Advocacy Certificate from Arkansas Coalition against Sexual Assault, a Certificate of Hospitality and Tourism from Florida Atlantic University, and a Certificate of Diversity and Inclusion from Cornell University. She is also a 2019 and 2020 Junior League of Little Rock Non-Profit Board Institute Graduate. She has been a featured speaker to several different organizations to help bring awareness to Period Poverty.

She has been married to her college sweetheart Michal for 14 years and they have one son, Kye. She enjoys serving her community, traveling, attending the Arkansas Symphony, researching anything associated with history, spending time with family and friends, and spending hours in the Hallmark Store.

In 2022, More Chances Period served 17,338 Menstruators with free period supplies.
