Susan Alturi, Little Rock Zoo



L-R: President Chris Franklin, Speaker Susan Alturi, and Vice President Tim Metcalf Rotary Vice President Tim Metcalf introduced this week's speaker, Susan Alturi, who is the Director of the Little Rock Zoo. Alturi is also a Rotarian with Club 99 in Little Rock. One of Arkansas' largest attractions, the Little Rock Zoo is currently breaking ground with renovation and expansion of animal exhibits at the front entry. They just received a \$12 bond for the new renovation.

The Little Rock Zoo was founded in 1924 and still houses many of its historic buildings. They house over 400 animals, many who are threatened or endangered. It is the only zoo in AR accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums, a designation that only 10% of facilities hold. We need zoos to inspire the next generation of conservationists. The Little Rock Zoo actively participates in conservation with the Species Survival plan and Saving Animals from Extinction (SAFE). They support conservation in the wild abroad as well as locally. Their newest local partnership is with the collared lizard. Other conservation programs are Wildlife SPS (with sloth bears), Cheetah Conservation Fund, International Rhino Foundation, Turtle Survival Alliance, South African Foundation for the Conservation of Coastal Birds, Dian Fossey Gorilla fund International and MYCAT Malaysian Conservation Alliance for Tigers. Conservation issues are important as a mass extinction event is underway, as we are losing species at a rate of 10,000 times faster than before. Unfortunately, 99% of animal extinction is due to human activity.

Always moving forward, the new exhibits at the Zoo include the new Colobys Monkey Habitat, Serval Cat habitat, Conservation Learning Center, Collared Lizard Habitat. There are new pathways and a new nature play area, as well. Future plans include renewing and updating the Zoo to increase the impact, expand the educational reach, expand access and link to War Memorial Park. There are many more projects coming up and the best way that you can help is to visit the zoo! If you haven't been there in a while, please make a trip up to Little Rock and see what our state zoo has to offer.

Alturi then turned the meeting over to Heather Baker, who brought out the true star of the show: Benny, the African Blackfooted penguin from South Africa. This warm-climate cutie stole the show by waddling around and greeting everyone in attendance.
