Bryan Smith, Alliance Rubber



L-R: President Chris Franklin, Speaker Bryan Smith, and Past President Forrest Spicher Past President Forrest Spicher introduced this week's speaker, Bryan Smith, an El Dorado native, who was a stand-out baseball player for now Arkansas Razorback Coach Dave Van Horn at Texarkana College. Smith is the Purchasing and Contract Director for Alliance Rubber Company. He also played professional baseball for several years with the Houston Astros (see baseball card photo below).

On March 7, 2023, Alliance Rubber celebrated their 100th year anniversary. To give us a little history of Alliance Rubber, Smith tells us about William Spencer, who, at the age of 13, left his home in Franklin, Kentucky, traveled a few years, and landed in Alliance, Ohio. One day when he was leaving for work at the age of 17, he noticed newspapers scattered across his neighbor's yards. An idea was born, so he approached Goodyear Rubber Company to ask for their rejected inner tubes. He went into his basement and cut the inner tubes into strips with scissors. He then took these rubber strips to the newspaper carriers and requested that they wrap them around their papers and let him know if they helped the papers stay intact. That is how Alliance Rubber was born on March 7, 1923.

In 1944, Spencer happened to be traveling through Hot Springs. As someone who suffered from arthritis, he took a thermal bath at one of our bathhouses and found that it soothed his aching joints. For that reason, he moved from Alliance, Ohio to Hot Springs, AR. They are now the largest manufacturer of rubber bands in the world and the only rubber band manufacturer in the United States.

Alliance is known as great corporate citizens and almost everyone has seen their huge and beautiful American Flag flying along the bypass. That was a vision of President Bonnie Swayze and the ball at the top of the flag is signed by all their employees. When driving by on Carpenter Dam Road, you can see their beautiful landscaping, called the Freedom Falls, which is dedicated to all veterans.

Alliance remains a privately owned company by the Spencer family, and they vow never to sell. They know that if they were to ever sell, it wouldn't remain in the United States.

They produce 2200 different products and sell to over 60 different countries. Smith credits their success and longevity to their 150 employees $\hat{\mathbf{a}} \in \mathbb{T}^{M}$ resolve and dedication. And they are very proud to say they are still made in the USA.


