Tanya Smith, Turpentine Creek Wildlife Refuge

President-Elect Sara Brown introduced this week's speaker, Tanya Smith, who is the Founder and
President of the Turpentine Creek Wildlife Rescue (TCWR). The Rescue is located 7 miles south of Eureka
Springs. TWCR is a non-profit sanctuary for survivors of the exotic animal trade and sits on 459 acres in
the Ozark Mountains. As an ethical animal tourism destination, they provide compassionate care and a
lifetime sanctuary for all of their animals, which include lions, tigers, caracals, bobcats, and even bears.
Tanya's family rescued their first lion in 1978 and formed the TWCR in 1992. They have rescued over 500
animals to date, with 33 coming to them in 2023 from a Florida facility that was closing. "Freedom Field"
was completed in time to receive these 33 animals.

Until recently, exotic cat ownership legislation varied from state to state. But passage of the Big Cat Public Safety Act in 2022 prohibits private ownership or public handling of the big cats, yet smaller species like bobcats and servals remain unregulated at the federal level. As the Big Cat Public Safety Act is enacted, more and more animals will need to be rehomed to legitimate sanctuaries like TCWR, and the smaller species will continue to be at risk of exploitation.

As a nonprofit organization, they are dependent on admission fees, lodging fees, retail purchases and donations. They have several options for tours of the refuge, including tram tours, virtual tours, and behind-the-scenes tours. They also have lodging available with Safari Suites, Zulu Safari Lodges, a Tree House Bungalow, Glamping Tents and an RV camp site.



Their mission is to provide a lifetime refuge for abused and neglected â€~big cats', (although they have some bears and a hyena as well). As with so many rescues, the circumstances that make this rescue necessary are because humans have made poor decisions. So, I encourage you all to get involved. We canâ \in TMt all take off to northwest Arkansas to work as volunteers at Turpentine Creek, and not everyone can make a donation, but there are opportunities and rescues everywhere. It is my hope that one day, these places will no longer be necessary. Until then, letâ \in TMs all do what we can to help.
