(Maternal Child Health, Community Economic Development, Water Sanitation & Hygiene, Disease Prevention & Treatment, Basic Education & Literacy, Peace Building & Conflict Prevention and Supporting Environment)

Our newest member of the Bequest Society is Jamie Higgins of the Rotary Club of Morrilton. The Bequest Society is a commitment made of at least \$10,000 from your estate to be paid at the time you work on earth has ended. The money can be earmarked for a variety of different projects. Higgins has committed \$25,000 to the Annual SHARE program to support both District Grants and Global projects. Other ways to give from your estate are Benefactor gifts of at least \$1,000 committed. 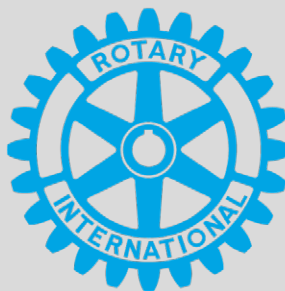
