"They're just gone" | An up-close look at the damage Eastern Kentucky flooding left behind

"This one mom looked at me and she said I don't know and she just started to break down, and then you ask those questions, how many people are in your family and she had five boys and a girl and so they need blankets, they need towels they need the absolute bare minimum right now, they don't have anything,' said WVLT First Alert Meteorologist Paige Noel.

After devastating flooding hit Eastern Kentucky, help is still needed in the mountains. "Where there were once homes there are no homes anymore they're just gone, they're just not even there, that's the worst part and then you see these creeks and streams you can see where the water was. People have compared it to hurricane Katrina and until you're up here you're kind of like that's not true, but it is. It kind of looks like the damage, I've seen tornadoes, I've seen the damage tornadoes have done and it's like that but on a larger scale, more widespread,' said Noel.
