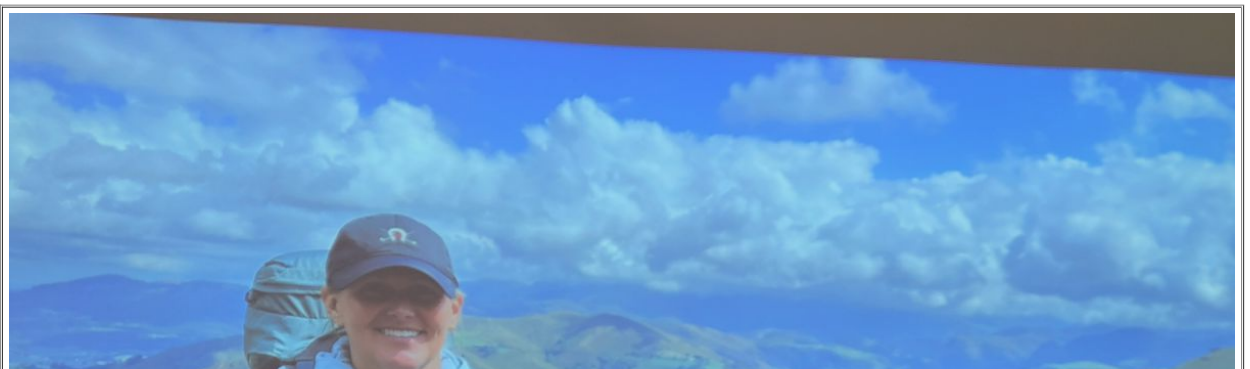
Foundation Minute-Mark reminded us of the impact of safe drinking water on our daily lives and the impact Rotary has made by installing a well in a Guatemalan village.

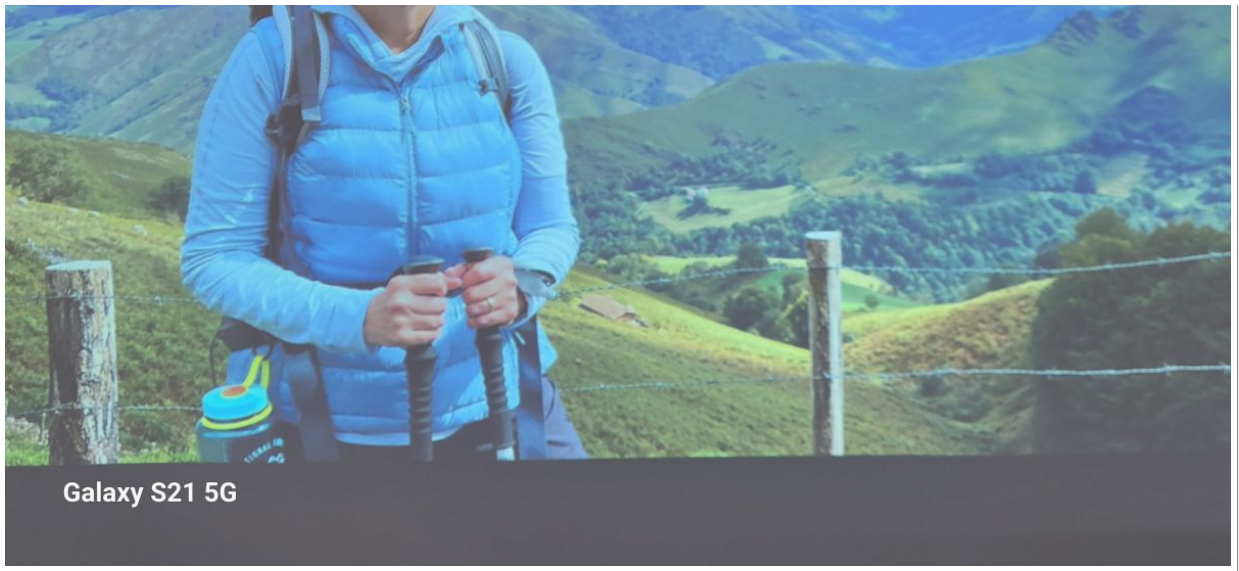

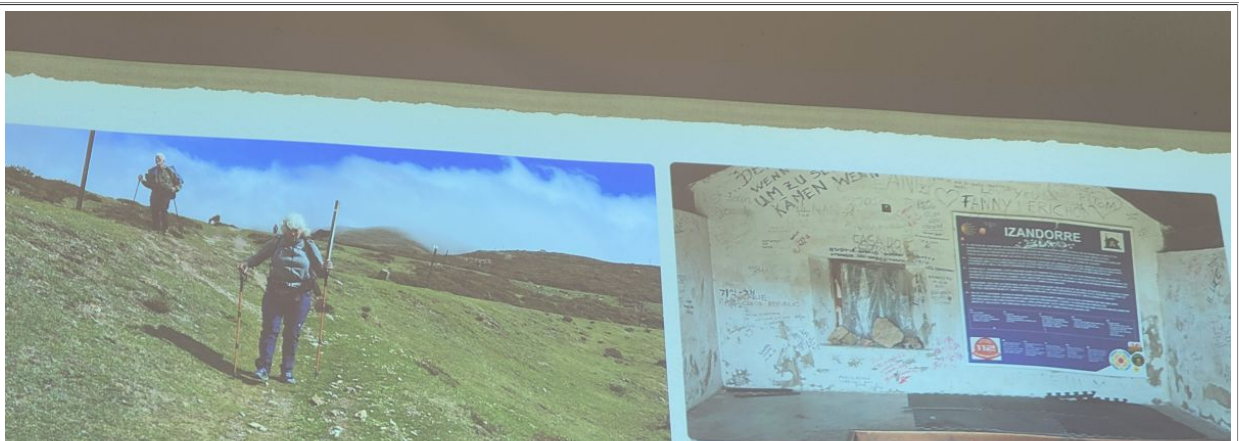
Galaxy S21 5G

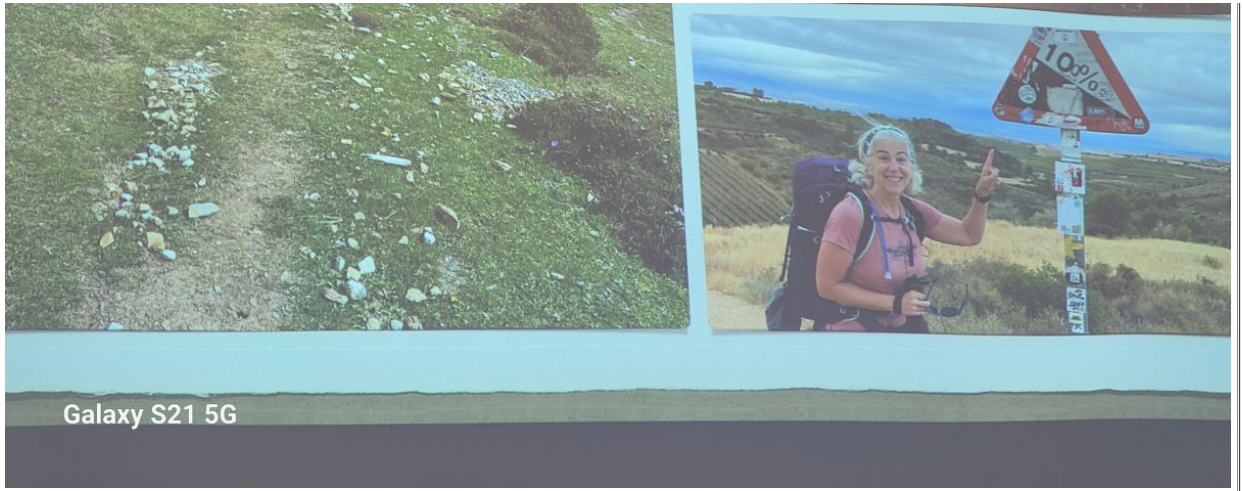
The trail is listed at 487 miles, but Tess estimates they covered 592 miles with travel for meals, hostels etc.

The blue trail across the top of Spain is the El Camino. In 2023, it is estimated 220,000 travelers made the journey. Tess and Beth targeted to travel between 13-20 miles per day. They targeted expenses of \$50 per day, but tended to spend much less. Total expenses including air travel were \$2,500. They plan to hike in Portugal this fall.
