Shipvard Tour 2024

31 Years ago, Rotary President Carla Peterson set in motion the first ever Sturgeon Bay Shipyard Tours. She shared she was unsure of its success.

The 31st Rotary Shipyard Tour is on the books. Through the years, the tour has changed many times. It has traditionally been a walking tour that includes various nautical sites. The shipping and boat building businesses have changed names, changed locations, closed their doors, but the tour survived and thrived.

In the fall of 2023, various options were considered to replace the walking tour. JD Patterson, owner of Shoreline Boat Tours, approached Rotary with the concept of a cruise viewing business from the waterfront. He presented the theme "Sturgeon Bay Working Waterfront, both past and present". The plan was to promote a cruise in conjunction with the Door County Maritime Museum, which would visit multiple sites around the Sturgeon Bay harbor.

Rotary would provide the promotion, ticket sales and checking in guests. Three days, June 21-23, were selected with four cruises daily. 300 tickets were available, of which 269 were electronically sold fairly quickly.

An unpublished feature was the addition of a multiple slide show presented on two large screens viewable while touring.

Other than weather cancelations for several cruises, the tours went very well and the response from guests was exceptional. The canceled cruises are covered by Shoreline Boat Tours weekly through Sept 2.

I got excited about viewing the Bay Ship Graving Dock from the water and messed up the shot. Tried for over an hour to rotate, but no luck.






