Mark has been a part of a multi-year process to study and analyze the safety and possible environmental impacts of line 5. Mark broke down the many different agreements that were met by Embridge and the State of Michigan. After all of the study’s and research has been complete it appears enclosing line 5 inside of a tunnel is going to be the best and most cost preventive way to continue. Embridge has dedicated over \$500 Million in this project. The entire study and costs have been paid for by the Canadian energy company and the final product could take 7-10 years to complete. When it is done the 10 ft tunnel should be roughly 100 ft below the floor of the Mackinac Straits. Thank you, Mark, for this insightful update on a very interesting topic.
