

To the 400 W Grand River site

Downtown District Complete River Trail Vision (2016)



- o Acquired the 400 W Grand River site in 1983 through a DDA
 - Required Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund grant
 - With this site, they developed a plan
 - Process to get easements along the River behind property owners
 - Has mixed results no complete
 - So focused on the ends that the city owned
- Boardwalk in Old Mill Park
 - Existed in the late 1980s at least 30 years old
 - Needed to be replaced wanted a more permanent solution
 - Used a concept drawing to get a grant
 - \$250,000 with a 20% match and cover overages
 - Would have concrete sidewalk along Putnam Rd


REPLACEMENT OF RED CEDAR RIVER TRAIL BOARDWALK





- Then go to 10� multi-use asphalt pathway the rest of the way along the river
- New fencing would boarder the walkway
- Add a crosswalk between park and McCormick Park
- Had to remove a couple trees & will replace them
- Will add a couple overlook decks at \$10,000 each
 - Wanted 2 more not funded
- Engineering estimate at \$310,000 project
- Garden Club was to donate to replacing the gazebo in the park with a more permanent vinyl structure
 - Want to bring this project into the park project and get additional matching funds
 - Could sell old gazebo and double its sale price with match
- Other fund raising opportunities
 - Public Spaces Community Places Grant
 - Every dollar up to \$50,000 is matched by MEDC
 - Putting together a grant to help with this project
 - · Hoping to launch in April with the Garden Club as first big donor (tied to Gazebo project)
 - Accepting offers on the gazebo and use the proceeds to help funding
 - Hope to have that help with site prep and add electrical
- Progress:
 - EGLE Permit received
 - Awaiting final NEPA clearance
 - Submitted to MDOT for May letting date
 - Working on a plan with key partners to launch in April-May to assist with funding
 - Summer construction anticipated
- Goal is to have key commitments
 - \$10,000 from DDA
 - He asked us if we thought they should set a high goal or take what can from key commitments
 - Would the community support a higher goal?
- Q/A:
- Chris: Some concern in clearing additional sidewalk area not done well this winter downtown
 - Decided 10 years ago that they would not keep the west side of Putnam St clear in winter - not clearing boardwalk

- Downtown sidewalks are an issue no place to move snow exc. in parking lanes
 - When city clears streets and sidewalks, the put the snow in the parking lanes
 - Then move it to piles and late at night haul it away
 - With new business owners, not told to clear sidewalks for light snowfall
 - City doesn t clear sidewalks with 1 of snow businesses have to do it
- It is a PR issue
- 400 W Grand River Ave lot
 - o 20 Years in the making
 - Parking lot planned and boat launch
 - Place to launch a kayak and head west down the river
 - Or put in above the bridge and go through the rapids and take out at launch



- Status plan summer construction
 - Submitted to EGLE for permit
 - Less intensive process
 - Plan it place a bid in spring with summer start
- Plan an access to a river trail in the future
- Q/A
 - Bob: With wood walkway is on pilings, would paved walkway need to be farther from river?
 - Still pretty close
 - Kay: In flood plane?
 - Had to get EGLE approval
 - Merlin: Some people haul kayaks on a trailer. Doesn to look like the parking area will accommodate a trailer.
 - Good point. Not considered yet.
 - Mark: Appreciate the work you have done on this. Kudos!
 - Walkway to McCormick Park looks like just markings on the pavement.
 - No signalized intersection
 - Not sure which is safer. Signal may give false sense of safety.
 - Kay: Would like to bring you back again later in spring to get progress
