



- Following Luke s presentation we had Happy Dollars
  - Jim noted that the CDC will soon be allowing 12-15 year olds to get Covid vaccinations
  - · Raj has had relatives in India who have died from the virus

    - She said it is due to many issues:
    - Corruption in India, gouging the cost of oxygen, no beds in hospitals, doctors diluting the vaccine to make it go farther, disinformation
    - Bodies are stacking up
    - Lots of people recovered from a mild strain of the virus, but are not protected by a second wave of a worse strain ♦ and have much worse effects ♦ many have died
    - Raj said if want to donate to India use:
      - Oxfam, Doctors without Borders or Red Cross & directed to India relief
    - Michigan needs 80% vaccination for herd immunity � unlikely
  - Laska talked about traveling last week and leaving her wallet in the bathroom at one stop

    - They returned to the stop and got the wallet back from those people J
