## Climate Change impacts on Water

- One of Climate Change serious challenges to fresh water sources with warm surface temperatures, is the formation of Harmful Algal Blooms, it would create;
  - Hypoxic conditions by blocking sunlight and depleting oxygen, causing massive fish kills.
  - Creates problems with drinking water treatment.
  - Produce a variety of toxic compounds (cyanotoxins) that might be harmful to animal and human health.
