Foundation Grant Proposal

Aforementioned, the club will have a special vote at our meeting on Tuesday, June 25th. You must be in attendance to vote. Please make it a priority to be there to vote on this proposal.

Fellow Rotarians,

The Foundation Board of Trustees and I would like to inform you that at our next meeting, June 25, 2024, we will be holding a special vote to pass a grant in support of the replacement playground for Fort Griswold at Ford Field in Downtown Northville. Anytime the Foundation is granting more than \$3,000 dollars, it needs to be decided by the club at large rather than simply the board of Trustees. Our hope is that we may pass this bill and support a community initiative that has been well over a decade in the making, as well as promote Rotary as a premier service organization in our community.

The Foundation is looking to financially support the build in two ways.

1. A \$50,000 grant to support the project and establish Rotary as a top billed sponsor of the park.
2. Organize a community fundraising campaign in which the foundation would match every dollar donated up to \$25,000.

The potential cash outlay we are requesting is \$75,000 from the foundation's current funds. \$50,000 for a direct grant, and up to \$25,000 as an incentive to our membership and the community to support healthy, accessible, and safe play for children and families in and around Northville. The Foundation currently has over \$300,000 dollars at our disposal, 10,000 of which has already been earmarked for a community impact donation.

In order to successfully pass this vote, we must have a quorum present at our next meeting.

Northville Rotary Foundation Bylaws state in Article I section 6:

"QUORUM OF MEETING OF MEMBERS

A quorum for meeting of the members shall consist of a majority, represented in person of the number of votes which may be cast by the entire voting membership"

Per Article III Section 2:

"Each active member of the Northville Rotary Club shall have (1) vote in the corporation, which must be exercised in person."

In other words, we need 27 of our 53 active members in attendance for a vote to be held.

If you have any concerns or questions, please reach out to me or another Trustee, we would be happy to discuss the plans in advance of the vote.
