Membership Dues

We have discussed our finances at some recent meetings and the Board has been discussing them as well. As we all know well, prices have increased everywhere lately, and our expenses are no exception. Although we don't have a high overhead and only a minor amount of incidentals, our fees per member for Rotary International and District 6400 have increased by 12% since our last dues increase, and the RI fees are set to increase another 16.5% over the next three years. (This is only the per-capita fee, and does not include

Our last membership dues increase was in January 2019, when dues increased by \$100 per year. The Board is proposing a modest (less than 10%) dues increase of \$30 per

year, effective July 1, 2023 (payable at \$15 per semi-annual billing period). We will discuss this at our meeting on April 25; if you have any comments and will not be at the meeting, please send them to Jennifer at rcnpresident@gmail.com or any other Board member.

Be the One to Support the Rotary Foundation - PDG Noel Jackson

In this moderated session participants will share information on Foundation giving, Foundation recognitions and awards, the excellent financial reputation of the Foundation, and the good that it does in the world.
