Rotary Well Watering

We are in need of volunteers to water the flowers at the Rotary Well in Northville. We will need consistent watering, about every other day. Please sign up at the link below; Susan Cobello will then create a watering schedule from the volunteers.

Below is information from Diane Pittaway who planted the flowers:

The flowers may need to be watered at least every other day if weather is hot & dry. The flowers along the retaining wall are going to need more water because of the tree roots and tree canopy. It is most effective to water at the ground to make sure the water soaks into the soil. The flowers in the barrels could be overwatered (not good) if the soil is not checked first.

The best way to tell if they need water is to feel the soil or if see they are drooping. The flowers in the barrels are petunias, superbells, and a lantana. The flowers along the retaining wall are impatiens. The plants behind the bench of the flagstone walk are hydrangea. They are perennial but need water too.

Virtual Tutor Volunteers Needed

Hello Northville Rotary Club,

I hope all is well with you. My name is Aryeh and I work for a nonprofit organization called Brilliant Detroit. Our mission is to create what we call Kid Success Neighborhoods - communities where kids 0-8 have everything they need to be safe, healthy, and school-ready. Our locations are rehabilitated houses that serve as "micro community centers" in the neighborhoods in which they are located. We currently have twelve sites in Detroit where we offer programming.

I am reaching out as we are seeking new volunteers for our virtual literacy tutoring programs and I thought this opportunity might be of interest to the members of the Northville Rotary Club. We are currently seeking tutors who can support our summer programs from July 11th-August 19th. We will also be offering tutoring during the school year starting in the fall.

Our virtual literacy programs meet twice a week for 30-45 minutes. We have a few program partners that utilize unique curricula and offer slightly different schedules. All of our literacy tutoring programs operate within the window of 3:30-7pm from Monday to Thursday with a variety of start times in that range. We ask that volunteers commit to a certain day and time slot every week. Consistency has shown to make a huge impact on our students' literacy and confidence!

To become a tutor, one must attend a program training, pass a background check (we cover the cost), and attend a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion training. There is a <u>document that outlines the three programs</u> we will be offering this summer. If anyone would like to serve as a virtual tutor, I am happy to answer any questions they may have and get them going with the onboarding process.
