- Opportunities to connect with fellow Rotarians who share your passion for service

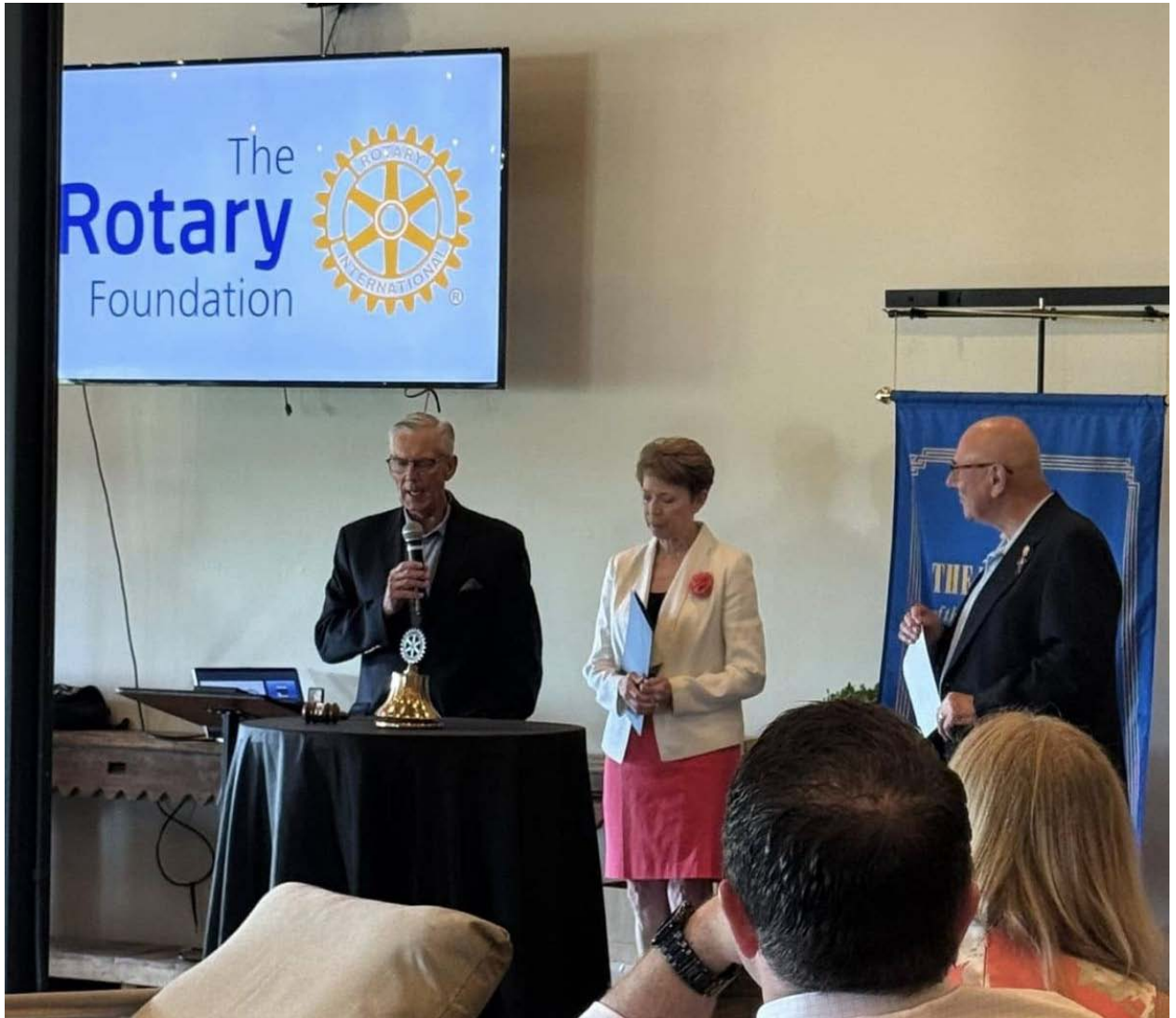
