Ongoing Project News

What is the current status of the Water Is Life project?

It is because of the success of our water well partnership with the Rotary Club of Freetown, Sierra Leone, over the last two decades

that a new and bigger opportunity has become realistically possible. The Rotary Foundation, which has provided matching funds for all of our project's grants, has an annual World-wide

Competition in which it awards--to just one winner-- a grant of \$2,000,000. It's called a Programs of Scale Grant.

Thanks to your ongoing generosity, and 100% our Successful History, we are eligible to compete.



It's a complicated process, but we know it will only make our work better by preparing for the competition. And, most importantly, regardless of whether we are awarded the Programs of Scale prize this year or after a couple years of collaboration with the RI Foundation, we know the beneficiaries of our work in Sierra Leone will benefit. Currently we've been asked to narrow our focus and resubmit our proposal. .As you can imagine, it is a very competitive opportunity, and we will be receiving notes from the judging committee as to how they would like us to further tweak our project for next year's process.

Is it feasible?

Based on our history, our team, our supporters, the relationships we've built, being part of Rotary International, and the other incredible connections based on the pre-requisites of the competition, we are more than qualified. Can we? Should we try to do it? We believe our answer is clearly, "yes". Regardless of how we fare, the result will be a stronger more sustainable Freetown/Fishers WaterIsLife Project, capable of serving more people, and leading other like-minded organizations to join our efforts to bring safe water access within 30 minutes' walk to everyone in Sierra Leone.

What does it look like? Winning projects tend to end up being for over \$4,000,000 due to the other organizations that likely will want to be part of the project. It will take 3 to 5 years to implement and will have a collaboration of Sierra Leone governmental ministries, other NGOs (non-governmental organizations), and Rotary.
