Creating Bridges to Independence and Inclusion for Adults with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

Tom Easterday, President of ILADD (Independent Living for Adults with Developmental/intellectual Disabilities), will discuss many of the challenges faced by adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities as they transition to adulthood and strive to become independent and fully included in society. He will also talk about the importance of providing opportunities for learning independent living skills, engaging in social activities, and enhancing physical fitness, as well as the need for options for housing, jobs, and transportation. Easterday will outline how ILADD is providing opportunities and options to adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities and the important role each of us can play in helping adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities achieve their independence and inclusion goals.

Check out what a Rotary Club is doing in Mexico

A community kitchen built by the Rotary Club of Nuevo Santander at a local school is ensuring hundreds of children have meals in low-income neighborhoods of Nuevo Laredo, a city on the U.S. border. $\hat{a} \in \infty$ Most of the houses in this area do not have running water or electricity, $\hat{a} \in$ says Club President Jorge Tello. The club launched the \$150,000 project in 2018, and the kitchen at the Comedor Santa María school began operating in August 2020; meals were first served to-go due to the COVID-19 pandemic before the dining room opened in May 2021. $\hat{a} \in \infty$ Operation costs for providing breakfast and lunch for 230 children every day is \$9,300 a month, $\hat{a} \in$ Tello says. The funds are donated by businesses and individuals. Club members supervise the operation, and Rotarians are providing solar panels to the facility.
