

# Meet the winners of the Second Annual Portee Leadership Connection Scholarships

**Carmel, IN** – The Rotary Club of Carmel is pleased to announce the second annual Portee Leadership Connection Scholarship winners. The scholarships, which include a laptop and \$2000 that can be used for tuition at a college, university, community college or trade school for each recipient, will be given to five local seniors.



The first three winners are from Christel House Watanabe High School. First is Manuel Gomez. He will be studying Mechanical Engineering at the University of Indianapolis. Next is Christian Gonzalez who will be studying Computer Science at IU Bloomington. Third is Maritza Hernandez. She will be studying Hospitality, Tourism and Event Management at IU

Bloomington. Roshani Guragain is from Carmel High School. She will be studying Pre-Med at IU Bloomington. The final winner, Kamia Price, will graduate from Simon Youth Academy at Circle Centre Mall and will be studying Elementary Education at Purdue University.

Selection of the five scholarship recipients was made by a review committee at Professional Management Enterprises, a nationally recognized staffing company based in Indianapolis led by Danny Portee. The scholarships are awarded with equal emphasis on merit and need.

Presentation of the awards will take place June 7 at the monthly meeting of the Rotary Club of Carmel, with Danny Portee addressing the recipients. Since its inception in 2021, Leadership Connection has impacted more than 350 Carmel and Indianapolis inner-city high school juniors and seniors in tandem with 100 business, community and non-profit executives and leaders.





McDermottâ€<sup>™</sup>s association with the Center dates to 2010, when he joined the Board of Directors and went on to serve as the boardâ€<sup>™</sup>s legal counsel and a member of its Executive Committee, Development Committee, Audit Committee, Finance Committee and Governance Committee.

#### About the Center for the Performing Arts

The mission of the nonprofit Center for the Performing Arts is to engage and inspire the Indiana community through enriching arts experiences. Its campus in Carmel, Indiana, includes the 1,500-seat Palladium concert hall, the 500-seat Tarkington proscenium theater and the black-box Studio Theater.
