Mike Hubbs is the Executive Director of Hamilton County Public Safety Communications. Mike was appointed to his position in 2022 by the County Commissioners. Prior to Mike's appointment he was the commanding officer of the Indianapolis/Marion County 911 Center. Mike oversaw 911 communications for the city of Indianapolis and Marion County for 8 years including which included critical incidents such as the Indiana State Fair Collapse, FedEx mass shootings and the downtown riots. Mike retired as a Major from the Marion County Sheriff's Office with 25 years as a law enforcement officer with federal, state and local law enforcement agencies. Mike is a graduate of the University of Indianapolis with a bachelor's degree in Spanish and Law Enforcement. Mike is native to the southside of Indianapolis and currently resides in Carmel.

David Roemer Named Leadership Connection Keynote Speaker

For the first time in its four-year history, Leadership Connection's keynote speaker comes from outside the Greater Indianapolis area and is a member of Rotary. He is David Roemer, CEO of Ideas United, Atlanta, Georgia, and member of the Rotary Club of Atlanta.

Here are 10 facts about David and Ideas United.

- David is a graduate of Ottawa Hills High School, Toledo, Ohio; and Emory University, Atlanta, Georgia.
- Upon graduation from Emory with a BBA, he was awarded a Robert T. Jones Scholarship and attended the University of St. Andrews (Scotland).
- While at Emory, he began an eight-year affiliation with Apple which led to the founding of Ideas United with several fellow Emory alumni 20 years ago. "When I was a student at Emory University, my dream job was working for Apple, and I was fortunate to become an Apple Campus Rep, followed by interning in Cupertino for four years. Working around such brilliant colleagues in Apple's Marketing team inspired me to explore what's possible at the intersection of creativity and technology."

• According to David about his team at Ideas United, "We help tell stories with organizations and people we believe in! Our core team collaborates alongside a global creative community to make meaningful work that's scalable to our partners' needs, always fresh, and leaves a lasting impact."

- "For many years, we just focused on running Campus Movie Fest, the world's largest student-run film festival, and empowering masses of students to tell their stories through short films all for free. We partnered with some extraordinary brands (such as Apple and Delta Air Lines) that supported the events and made it all possible. Ideas United recognized that the events made it possible to discover the world's next best directors, animators, musicians and more, and the company evolved into a creative studio.
- Per David, "We specialize in a few key areas. First, we partner with premier brands to help them tell their stories differently (partners have included Starbucks, Disney, PGA, Amazon, The Coca-Cola Company, and more). Second, we partner with leading universities and nonprofits to help them make a positive impact (Smithsonian, Emory University, Georgia Tech, and the Arnold & Winnie Palmer Foundation, among many others). And third, We've worked with platforms ranging from Amazon Prime Video and PlayStation to Warner Bros. Discovery to help unleash fresh concepts for long-form content."
- Additional clients have included PGA TOUR, ABC, Brandeis University, California Community Colleges, Carter's, DC Universe, Fisher-Price, Google, Lehigh University, Mercedes-Benz, Atlanta Falcons, UC Health, NCAA, Realtor.com, and The Weather Channel.
- A sampling of David's leadership endeavors includes Board of Directors, Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce; Host Committee, TOUR Championship, PGA TOUR; Chair-Elect, Advisory Committee of the Robert T. Jones, Jr. Program, Emory University; Board of Directors, Atlanta Speech School; Board of Directors, Community Foundation of Greater Atlanta; and Board of Directors, Arnold and Winnie Palmer Foundation.
- Other key endeavors include Program Chair of Rotary Club of Atlanta, YPO (Young Presidents Organization), Leadership Atlanta, and Technology Executives Roundtable.
- David is a contributor to Forbes.com and has been named one of Atlanta's most admired CEOs of 2024 by Atlanta Business Chronicle.

David Roemer will address Leadership Connection attendees the afternoon of Friday, November 15, at the Carmel Clay Public Library.

Leadership Connection has touched the lives of 350 high school juniors and seniors; awarded \$15,000 in college scholarships + 10 laptops; and has brought together numerous business executives, non-profit leaders, and elected officials to inspire tomorrow's leaders. It is a branded event of the Rotary Club of Carmel.
