September 6th Speaker is Jeff Jellison

The presentation will be on *The Coronerâ* \in ^{ms} *Role in the Community,* an overview of the Coronerâ \in ^{ms} Office and how the community is served. He will touch briefly on the Fox Hollow case and his efforts to identify 10,000 unidentified human remains.

Deputy Coroner Jeff Jellison has announced his intention to run for Hamilton County Coroner in the upcoming 2022 Republican Primary Election. A lifelong resident of Hamilton County, Jellison graduated from Noblesville High School and attended Ball State University.

After attending Ball State University, Jellison worked as a dispatcher and reserve police officer for the Noblesville Police Department for two years, then served 10 years as a police officer for the City of Carmel. Most recently, Jellison has served six years as a deputy coroner in Hamilton County.

Jellison is a graduate of the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy and maintains a Medicolegal Death Investigator certification.

Jellison's law enforcement and coroner training includes certificates from Northwestern University, Indiana University School of Medicine Department of Toxicology, Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI), Indianapolis Police Department, Indiana University Kokomo Division of Continuing Studies and Indiana State Coroners' Association.

Community Grants Due 9/15

The Community Grant Application must be submitted by a Carmel Rotarian on behalf of a charitable community organization. The Carmel Rotarian will be the sponsor for the organization as the application goes through the entire process. The Rotarian may not be a salaried employee of that organization, however they may volunteer with that organization or serve on their board. Grants will be awarded for up to \$2,000 and one of the stipulations is that the organization can't have just received money from the club in the last cycle. What is the IGNITE App?

The Ignite App is a mobile app for smartphones and tablets designed by DACdb. This app takes the most common tools and features from DACdb and makes them easier and more convenient to use from your mobile device. How to Download the IGNITE App:



- 1. Open up the App Store (Apple) or Google Play Store (Android) on your device.
- 2.Enter "Ignite" in the search bar.
- 3. Scroll down until you find the IGNITE app and click on the red fire icon.
- 4. Download the app by clicking the "Get" or "Install" button.

Sign in to the IGNITE App:

Simply enter your DACdb login credentials.

Remember, IGNITE is powered by (and is effectively just a better version of) DACdb.

- · Username: This is your email address (the one you received this message on)
- Password: If you don't remember your DACdb password you can reset it by going to <u>www.DACdb.com</u> and click "Forgot/Reset Password?"



Enriching the Community through Arts Experiences


Jeff McDermott President/CEO The Center for the Performing Arts The Great American Songbook Foundation
