Friday, November 10 Presentation: Rick Markoff LT...My Vietnam Story

Five Facts About My Service:

I received my commission as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army through ROTC at the University of Missouri in June, 1970.

After Officers Basic Training at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, and initial assignment with the 3rd Battalion, 3rd Artillery Group, Fort Knox, Kentucky, I began my tour of duty in Vietnam, September 7, 1971.

My primary duty was Fire Direction Officer at Fire Base Michelle, approximately 30 miles north of Saigon.

I was awarded both the Bronze Star and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Palm, and was promoted to the rank of First Lieutenant.

My unit, the 42nd Artillery Group, was disbanded in early 1972, and I returned to America the end of March that year.

Do know I appreciate this opportunity our Club have given me to speak.
