August 23rd Speaker is Andris Berzins

Andris Berzins is the son of Latvian immigrants and a native Hoosier. Andris is a graduate of North Central High School and received a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice from Indiana University in 1994. Andris has worked as a Special Investigator in the insurance industry for the past 36 years, 27 of which have been spent at Federated Insurance, where he currently works as an SIU Team Supervisor.

Andris has been active in the Latvian community, graduating from the Indianapolis Latvian School and the Garezers Summer High School in Three Rivers, Michigan, as well as participating in folk dance groups and choirs. Andris holds dual citizenship and speaks, reads and writes Latvian fluently. He served as the President of the Latvian Community Center for over 15 years, and on the Board of Directors of many other Latvian organizations. Andris has led and hosted many national Latvian events, most recently in 2023 the American Latvian Association Congress in Carmel.



Andris currently serves as the Honorary Consul for the Republic of Latvia to the State of Indiana and is President of the Carmel and Jelgava Sister Cities Committee. He also serves as the Chairman of the Mayor's Sister Cities Advisory Board and serves on the Board of the Directors of the Carmel International Arts Festival, leading the Sister Cities and Cultural Diversity programs.

The presentation will be on *The Coronerâe™s Role in the Community*, an overview of the Coronerâe™s Office and how the community is served. He will touch briefly on the Fox Hollow case and his efforts to identify 10,000 unidentified human remains.

Deputy Coroner Jeff Jellison has announced his intention to run for Hamilton County Coroner in the upcoming 2022 Republican Primary Election.

A lifelong resident of Hamilton County, Jellison graduated from Noblesville High School and attended Ball State University.

After attending Ball State University, Jellison worked as a dispatcher and reserve police officer for the Noblesville Police Department for two years, then served 10 years as a police officer for the City of Carmel. Most recently,

Jellison has served six years as a deputy coroner in Hamilton County.

Jellison is a graduate of the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy and maintains a Medicolegal Death Investigator certification.

Jellison's law enforcement and coroner training includes certificates from Northwestern University, Indiana University School of Medicine Department of Toxicology, Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI), Indianapolis Police Department, Indiana University Kokomo Division of Continuing Studies and Indiana State Coroners' Association.
